Refer page 3 of schedule for details. Your DOB is required. Nominations after 10 October will not be considered. Some riders have nominated two horses – you need to choose one horse only.

REMINDER

- Horse Arrival: FROM MIDDAY TUESDAY, 14 October. Please schedule your arrival after this
 time. The stables have to be cleaned and prepared for new arrivals after a big event held
 the weekend prior to the Championships
- Queensland competitors: It is compulsory on arrival at the venue that all QLD competitors'
 hand in a "Horse Health Bio Security Declaration" to the Rider Information Desk or the
 Stable Manager before entering the stables. The Declaration form is on the website.

The Organising Committee would like to thank you for your entry and wish you the very best of luck at the event. We have prepared the following information for you that should address questions you may have and make these Championships a memorable one for you and all involved.

Competition

Competitors be aware that competition conditions/rules apply from the moment horses arrive at the venue.

We encourage you to read through the important information regarding the Championships. Attached are details of the "Time Draw" and the list of reserves for each competition. Riders placed on the reserve list will be notified of scratchings as they occur. Horse/riders on the reserve list who are not offered a ride will receive a refund for their entries after the event. Riders on the reserve list that have to travel a long distance to the event are given the opportunity to withdraw and receive a refund if they withdraw by 10 October. Regular updates will be posted on the web.

A revised draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals. The starting order will not alter and a move up system may apply. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition.** All changes will be posted on the notice board outside the Rider Info Office. We will endeavour to keep changes to a minimum.

The draw for the CDI-W, CDI-U25 & CDI-Y competitions will be conducted immediately after the Fitness Inspection.

Withdrawals/Scratchings: We suggest that all riders look at the rules for National Championships (from Section 10 page 107 in the current EA Dressage rule book). Pay particular attention to WITHDRAWALS and the penalty for non-compliance. Withdrawals/Scratchings: No competitor shall without permission from the Ground Jury, withdraw from a competition within 8 hours before the start of the competition. A written statement giving reason for withdrawal must be lodged at the Event Office (indoor arena). prior to the commencement of competition. During the competition, from Thursday to Sunday, all competitors who withdraw from a competition must complete a withdrawal form and hand it in to the Event Office. Withdrawal forms will be available from the Riders Info Office (opposite the Rider's Retreat) and also on the Event website. NOTE: Vet certificates provided by persons associated with Teams or the competitor are not accepted.

Competitors are to pay for any veterinary treatment and supplies provided by Veterinarians during the event.

 In circumstances where the competitor wishes to withdraw from a competition shortly before the starting time for their test (e.g. if horse is found to be unsound, rider illness or for safety reasons) then the rider should ask a steward to call the Chief Steward or Technical Delegate who will inform the Judges and Organisers. For EA level tests, riders who withdraw from the first test of the day will not be allowed to start in the second test.

Grand Prix, CDI-W Freestyle & GP Special: The top 15 horses in the Grand Prix who gain a score of 60% or more will be eligible for the Freestyle (CDI-W). A score of 58% or more is required for the Grand Prix Special.

The top 6 horses in the CDI-U25 Grand Prix and the top 10 horses in the CDI-Y Individual competition that gain a score of 60% or more will be eligible for the respective Freestyle competition.

Riders may ride **only one horse in the CDI Freestyle competitions**. Riders with two horses must declare before the time draw on Thursday which horse they wish to ride in the Freestyle.

CDI-W, CDI-U25 & CDI-Y Horse Arrival Examination Thu 12noon – 2.00pm (stables). Trot up (Fitness Inspection) Thurs. from 4.30pm in Arena 4. Refer separate information sheet for details.

Riders at all levels must have their horse's **EA papers** available for inspection if requested. **Swabbing** will take place during the event. Penalty fines will be imposed for those who do not have their horse papers available at the event.

FEI Rider Representative for the CDI-W, CDI-Y: Wendi Williamson from New Zealand is the representative. The Rider Info Office will have contact details for Wendi.

Team Entries/Chefs d'Equipe: Team entries must be nominated by 5.00pm on Wednesday, 16 October at the Event Management Office located in the indoor arena. Reserves may be nominated in case of withdrawals due to veterinary or rider illness.

Use of arenas prior the event: Arenas 9 and 10 will be open for competitors to use prior to the Championships. Arena 4 will be open from Wednesday. Arena 6 will be available for competitors competing indoors from Tuesday afternoon. A notice will be placed on the notice board in the Rider Information Office indicating the arenas to be used for warm-up on competition days. Each competition arena will be allocated a specific warm-up arena. Please use the warm-up arenas as instructed so that our stewards can control the flow into the competition arenas.

Training & Arena Familiarisation: Please refer to the timetable that is posted on the competitor section of the websites or on the Rider Info notice board during the event. Remember, as per the rules, you can ride in the competition arenas before the competition <u>only</u> at the times designated.

Lunging Yards in the stable area are for lunging horses only and are open during daylight hours only. Horses are not to be left unsupervised in the lunge yards at any time.

Freestyle competitors: Information on the format required for freestyle music on page 4 Riders entered in Freestyles are to advise at the time they check in to get their accreditation, if they wish to withdraw their intention to start if they qualify as per the conditions of entry.

Saddlery & Equipment

Reminder: Competition rules/conditions apply once horses arrive at the venue.

Bridle numbers, please use your existing bridle number. In the case of a double up of numbers, the OC have allocated one of the combinations with a temporary bridle number for this event. Please note that bridle numbers (one on each side) must be displayed on the horses saddlecloth, bridle and/or halter at all times other than when in the stable, this rule applies to all horses. Competitors grazing horses must take extreme care and have horses in full control of the handler, if grazing horses appear to be upsetting competing horses or horses under saddle they will be asked to return to the stable enclosure.

Please do not graze or lead horses or have dogs close to the competition arenas when horses are competing.

Protective headgear: As per national rules for EA competitions.

CDI competitions: Riders aged 25 years and under must wear Protective headgear at all times **including** during the Fitness **Inspection**. Riders who are 26 years and older and who are riding Horses that are seven (7) years and older may wear a top hat instead of Protective Headgear. Protective Headgear is recommended to be worn by all riders at the Fitness Inspection.

Whips & Gear: A reminder that whips that do not comply with current EA Rules (must not exceed 1.2m horses, 1m ponies in entirety), will not be allowed in the warm-up and competition areas. For CDI-W/CDI-U25, CDI-Y competitors, the FEI ruling for whips in the warm-up or at any time while training is 1.2m.

For **National Championships**, whips are permitted for levels **up to and including Advanced only**. Riders must be in competition dress when presenting to the gear steward for their test (e.g. bandages etc removed). The Gear Check will take place after the completion of each test.

Whips: CDI-W/U25 & CDI-Y: It is, under penalty of elimination, forbidden to carry a whip of any kind while competing. However, the use of one whip (max. 1.2m, 1m for ponies), in the practice area is allowed.
 The whip must be dropped before entering the space around the competition arena or the rider will entail a penalty (refer Art. 430).

Stables

Stables will be open on Tuesday, 15 October at noon. Due to the many changes we get with stable allocation the allocation will be posted on the website prior to the event. Any questions or enquiries regarding stabling can be directed to Cathie Drury-Klein on 0417 224 432.

The stable allocation will be posted on the website at least 10 days prior to the event

Horse Arrival times are restricted to day light hours only between 6.30am to 6.00pm daily.

 Late bookings or changes to stable bookings, bedding etc can be made on line on Nominate via the link below. A late fee applies https://www.nominate.com.au/EquestDn/Event.aspx?event=16378&eventlist=2

Stable security will be in place overnight for the entire stable block and only authorised people will be admitted. Riders and grooms will be given a "wrist band" on arrival at the venue. Entry to the stables after hours will only be permitted to riders/grooms/officials who have the appropriate "wrist band".

- Competitors please place a notice containing the contact details of the person responsible for the horse in the "information pocket" located in front of each stable door in case of emergency.
 - **EA Stallion Policy applies**. If your horse is a stallion, the **EA Stallion Identification Card** with a green background must be placed on the outside of the stable or yard. Download the card from the EA website.
 - Communal Tack rooms will be available in each row for competitors to share if sufficient spare stables are available. Please leave these swept and clear out any feed or mess when you leave. There is a \$10 cash deposit for private tack room keys refundable on departure following pre-departure inspection. It may not be possible to allocate private tack rooms to all. Preference has been given to competitors staying for longer periods..

Peter Rocca is the Stable Manager during the event. Peter will be staying on site from **midday** Tuesday, 15 Oct. Please contact Peter if you are having transport problems and delayed arrival is expected (see page 5 for phone details).

- No bikes, scooters or prams are permitted in the stables. Golf buggies or similar permitted only during unloading of gear on arrival or loading of gear on departure. Dogs are permitted in the stable complex but must be in full control of the handler at all times (on a leash). Dogs are not to be left in stables nor tied up in stable aisles.
- SMOKING is not permitted in stables or stable aisles. Stable accreditation will be denied to those who do
 not observe this rule.

Note: Please bring your own feed and water bins, shovels, etc as these are not provided at SIEC. Bedding ordered with stable bookings will be placed in the stable. A limited supply of bedding will be available to purchase during the event at the Rider Info Office at \$15.00 per bag and <u>must be paid</u> for at the time of ordering, orders must be made at the Rider Info Office.

Bedding (shavings): It is a requirement of the venue that only bedding purchased through the event is allowed unless competitors have provided SIEC with a Veterinary certificate and have been granted an exemption. Therefore, all competitors must purchase their bales through the event. To apply for an exemption

Please place order for shavings with prior to arrival to avoid unnecessary delay in getting stables ready for horse arrivals. Placing orders for bedding on the day of arrival creates additional work for the stable manager and venue staff at a very busy time.

Produce & Deliveries: Macarthur Stockfeeds will deliver to SIEC most days. Ph: 02 4655 3567. Leppington Feed Supplies will deliver normally on Tue & Thu, ph 02 9606 5427 (orders must be pre-paid). Feed deliveries: Please advise the feed merchant of your stable number if you are ordering a delivery of feed.

Day parking: Day parking is in P7 and North Camping Area. Day yards are available in the North Car Park. Horses may not be left in day yards overnight. All stallions must be stabled.

Stable cleaning. As per the conditions of entry, a cleaning fee of \$82 per stable/tack room will be payable if stables are not left completely empty and clean. All bedding is to be removed and stables swept prior to departure.

Camping /Cabins

The cabin & camping allocation is on the website. Changes or additions to camping requests can be made on **Nominate** (here]. Vehicles parked in the camping area that are not campers may be towed away. Please do not block the camping area with your vehicles.

Cabin keys: A \$10 deposit for cabin keys is payable and refunded on return of the key.

We have endeavoured to fulfil rider requests as much as possible, however with such a large number of competitors it is not possible to accommodate all in the South Camping area. Please display your camping details provided by Nominate when you entered the event on the windscreen of truck/caravan/float or attach to tent. Please note we are charged for every vehicle connected to power so if you have two (2) camp vehicles connected and have only booked and paid for one you will be charged for the second outlet.

Car Parking: Car parking is available on site. Please follow instructions from the Centre Management staff regarding where to park your vehicles. Floats/trucks/cars can be parked along the roadway opposite the cabins.

Vehicles are not allowed in the competition and training areas.

Music Check timetable and Music upload

For all competitions except for the Grand Prix CDI-W Freestyle a music check only will be scheduled. Your music will be played for around 1-2 minutes and it is the rider's responsibility to be present at the published time to ensure their music is correct. The timetable for music checks is on the website.

IMPORTANT: All Freestyle music must be uploaded to the website on the link below – no later than 16 October 2019 so that it can be checked, filed and prepared for the event. If you have music currently on a memory stick or a CD you need to convert this to a music file format as below.

Reminder: Competition rules/conditions apply once horses arrive at the venue.

General information

SIEC is located just off the **M7 motorway.** Coming from the north you take the Horsley Park exit, turn right into Wallgrove Road. Coming from the South, you take the Elizabeth Drive exit; go straight ahead at the traffic lights along Wallgrove Road, then turn right into Saxony Road. There is a toll on the M7, which you can pay within 48 hours.

Toll number: 13 86 55

Arrival at SIEC: Competitors arriving at the venue for the first time with horses in tow will be admitted to the grounds. After this initial entry, you must show your ID (wrist band) to gain entry from Thursday. Access to the SIEC is via Saxony Rd. Saxony Rd is approximately 1km south (towards Elizabeth Drive) of the Horsley Drive intersection on Wallgrove Rd. There is a roundabout on Wallgrove Rd at Saxony Rd. Once on Saxony Rd there is another roundabout approximately 800m east into the entrance of SIEC. Once inside the SIEC follow the new access road along past the indoor arena and on to the stables. Proceed to horse unloading area in front of the stable block. After unloading horses, tack and feed, please move your vehicle without delay either to the assigned camping location or to the car/float parking area.

Facilities: We request that competitors take the utmost care in looking after the wonderful facilities that are being provided. SIEC is located within a Regional Park and is environmentally sensitive. Please take pride in this fantastic venue and keep the toilets and amenities block clean. **Dogs must be on a leash at all times.**

Please take care when walking in bush areas as snakes and ticks are about. A large goanna and friends are common visitors to the area around the rider retreat and camping areas.

Riders Retreat: Located in front of the stable complex the Riders Retreat is available to competitors. If you are camping on the grounds or staying in cabins, you are welcome to use the facilities at any time. Facilities include, cook top and oven, microwave, fridge, television & video equipment. We do ask that you keep the area clean and tidy.

Riders Welcome: The welcome will be held on Thursday, 17 Oct. starting at approx 6.30pm in the "Nationals Hub" in the indoor arena.

Accreditation/Tickets: Riders will be entitled to free entry, along with one groom per horse and one owner per horse where different to the rider. Riders and grooms will receive a "wrist band" on arrival at the venue. The "wrist band" will allow the wearer to be admitted to the grounds daily and to the stables at all times. Any additional tickets must be purchased at the normal rate. Riders and grooms must report in person to the Rider Info Office to be issued with their "wrist bands".

From Wednesday, the Riders Info Office located opposite the Riders Retreat will be open to issue accreditation. Each rider will receive a plaque memento, and a complimentary copy of the programme booklet.

Owners (where different to the rider) can be posted an entry pass if we have been advised by 5 October and the address provided. The pass will entitle them to access to the venue throughout the event. Access to the stables is allowed during daylight hours without a wristband. Owners who would like access to the stables at all times, should report to the management office or Rider Info Office with their gate pass. Owners must be the same as on EA horse registration papers.

Seating: A section of seating to the right of the commentary box will be set aside for competitors/grooms/owners. Seats 120-144, rows A/B/C/D.

Tickets: For spectators, entry to the event is free on Thu/Fri & Sun and on Sat \$20 for adults, \$5 for 16 years and under. Seat is unallocated unless reserved on-line. (<u>Link to reserved seats on Saturday</u>)

Catering: Breakfast will be available from Wednesday morning at the catering outlet located in front of the stables.

Bicycles: If you have a bicycle at home, we suggest you bring it along as the distance from the stables to arenas is significant. S.I.E.C. management requests that helmets be worn. The roads are designated "public roads" and normal road rules apply. Horses always have right of way - please take care. **Bicycles left in inappropriate or dangerous places will be removed without question. No bikes allowed in the stable complex.**

Golf buggies: If you have a buggy or similar please note **NO** buggies in the stables (unless authorised by the stable warden for off loading of gear). Please take care when driving through the venue, and horses have right of way.

• Presentations: Will take place mainly at the end of the day in the Nationals Hub unless otherwise advised. On Thursday the presentations for the PSG, Inter A and Inter II will take place during the Rider Welcome.

Please join us for "**Happy Hour** – glass of wine and finger food" during presentations. The Rider Welcome is sponsored by Jarrett Arena Mirrors & Callum Park Equestrian and supported by *Woodside Warmbloods*. Presentations and Happy Hours on Friday & Saturday are supported by Boutique Equines, Nu Walla and Wild Oats.

- Children are welcome at the Happy Hours but NO children please on the podium at the presentation
 ceremonies. The Presentation timetable will be posted on the website prior to the event and updates will be
 posted on the notice board at the Rider Info office.
- We invite non-riding owners to be present at the prize giving ceremonies. We request that riders tell their
 owners of this arrangement. This is one form of acknowledgement and involvement that we can provide to
 owners who support our sport.

The CDI-W Grand Prix Freestyle to Music will be a **mounted** presentation in the indoor arena.

Prize Money will be posted out within 10 working days of the competition and will be paid to nominated credit cards or bank account provided on the entry. In special circumstances if arranged payment can be made by cheque. Competitors who are entitled to prize money for more than one competition will receive one payment covering all prize money. The reason for this change in procedure is to reduce the admin workload and the number of cheques to be written. Note: Prize money will not be paid unless the declaration was completed on the entry form. Prize money will be paid to the owner of the horse as per EA rules.



Test papers: The Championships will use the LiveScore Dressage paperless scoring. Test papers will be emailed to competitors as soon as the Ground Jury has signed off on the competition. For the CDI-W, CDI-U25 & CDI-Y, paper scoring and LiveScore dressage scoring will be in place. Riders will be advised regarding the format for their test papers.

Welfare of the horse - FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

SIEC Code of Conduct

- SIEC accepts no liability for the loss or damage of vehicles, accessories or the contents or any goods or articles while on the premises
- All vehicles, except those authorised, must park in designated car or truck parking areas
- All roads are designated public carriage ways. All persons visiting the site must obey venue signage and all reasonable directions given by authorised venue staff
- Unless licensed, alcohol is not permitted to be bought onto the site. All persons visiting the site must use granite paths and mowed areas at all times
- Camping is only allowed in designated areas
- Fires are not permitted at the venue
- All dogs are to be kept on a lead and all dog waste collected
- Riders at all times must be respectful of other riders and of the venue
- All riders must wear safety helmets, appropriate footwear and maintain their riding gear in good order
